Tip1: comb cut.

To achieve a short cut on a cat without shaving it all the way down, use the KM2 Clippers with a #30 blade and a Wahl metal guard comb. The example shown was accomplished with a 1" metal comb on a pre-groomed cat that is clean and free of any mats or tangles.

Attach a Clipper Vac to the KM2 and keep the suction tab closed. Start on the back just above the base of the tail and work upward in reverse. Continue working against the growth of the hair until the entire back is clipped. Do not worry about neat lines around the head and legs at this point.



Tip #2: comb cut.

After completing the back area, begin on the belly by working downward first and then upward against the growth of the hair to even out the finish



Tip #3: comb cut.

To continue with the comb cut on the tail, first shave down toward the tip of the tail, stopping approx 3-4" before the end. Hold the desired amount of hair needed for the pom-pom in one hand while clipping with the other. Then reverse the clippers and work backward, against the lay of the hair to achieve an even length that matches the rest of the body. Carefully blend in the hairs around the edge of the pom-pom in with the rest of the tail.



Tip #4 comb cut.

Holding each leg out to keep the skin taut, work in reverse to clip the hair down even with the rest of the body. As you work down the leg where the hair is naturally shorter, the clipped hair will begin to blend in.

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Tip 5: comb cut.

To achieve a neat line around the neck, hold the natural ruff forward with one hand while clipping in reverse with the other. Take care not to grab any remaining ruff with the suction. Begin creating the ruff line at the back of the neck and working forward, keeping your line even with the cat's head. Using the metal combs combined with suction is a great way to trim the ruff shorter on any style.
